Colorful Creations

An invitation to explore
color at CAM



Today we are going to take a look at how artists use color in the exhibition *Stories of Resistance*. This is an exhibition featuring artists from around the world whose artworks share ideas about standing up for what's right. We're going to look at the way they communicate these ideas using **COLOR**.

Artists love to play with color! We choose different colors to add contrast or to set a specific mood.

There are three main characteristics of color:

Hue: the name of the color, (red, green, blue, etc.)

Value: how light or dark it is

Intensity: how bright or dull it is

And do you know about primary and secondary colors? Red, blue, and yellow are the primary colors. When artists mix two primary colors, they make the secondary colors purple, orange, and green.

Red + Blue = Purple

Red + Yellow = Orange

Blue + Yellow = Green

What's your favorite color?

Now, take a slow walk through the exhibition, and find an artwork that grabs your attention.

Think about how the artwork you are looking at uses hue, value, and intensity.

What colors do you notice in the artwork?
What kind of mood do they create?
