

Making Comics, New Art in the Neighborhood, 2021

For this year's New Art in the Neighborhood artists, the restrictions of the pandemic provided an opportunity to hone foundational drawing skills and lean into creative approaches to narrative. Using cartoonist and author Lynda Barry's book *Making Comics* as their guide, they immersed themselves in drawing, storytelling, and collaboration. Through Barry's insights, methods, and exercises they learned the practice of creative routine and active, sustainable art making. Special guests Sarah Paulsen, Dan Zettwoch, and former CAM Director of Education Tuan Nguyen also introduced different techniques and approaches to utilizing comics as an art form.

Established in 1995, New Art in the Neighborhood is the Museum's flagship education program, providing

St. Louis-area high school students with preprofessional art instruction and opportunities to work with contemporary artists from around the world. This free, in-depth program provides twenty participants, ages 14 to 18, with more than fifty hours of studio time each semester, immersing them in contemporary art and ideas in order to develop a greater critical awareness of art history and their own art-making.



Dan Zettwoch is an illustrator, cartoonist, and printmaker. He earned his BFA in visual communications with an emphasis in illustration from Washington University in St. Louis, where he teaches in the Sam Fox School's MFA in Illustration & Visual Culture program.
