Finalists selected for tenth GREAT RIVERS BIENNIAL 2022



September 29, 2021 (St. Louis, MO) – The Contemporary Art Museum St. Louis and the Gateway Foundation announce the finalists for the tenth Great Rivers Biennial Arts Award Program (GRB). The finalists were chosen from among 105 applicants by a distinguished panel of jurors. The selected artists work in a wide range of media, including painting, drawing, printmaking, sculpture, ceramics, textile, moving image, installation, and performance. From the finalists, three artists will be selected to receive \$20,000 and be featured in the Great Rivers Biennial exhibition at CAM, September 9, 2022–February 12, 2023.

The next stage of the GRB will involve individual studio visits from the jurors on October 14 and 15, 2021. The GRB jurors are **Carmen Hermo**, Associate Curator for the Brooklyn Museum's Elizabeth A. Sackler Center for Feminist Art; **Jen Liu**, a New York-based visual artist working in video, painting, dance performance, and biomaterial; and **Hamza Walker**, Director of LAXART, a nonprofit art space in Los Angeles, and adjunct professor at the School of Art Institute of Chicago. Walker was a juror for the first Great Rivers Biennial, in 2004. The artists selected for the Great Rivers Biennial exhibition will be announced in October. CAM Chief Curator Wassan Al-Khudhairi and Assistant Curator Misa Jeffereis will act as organizing curators, and artists will work closely with them for the successful implementation of their exhibitions.

The Great Rivers Biennial, a collaborative initiative between CAM and the Gateway Foundation, identifies talented emerging and mid-career artists working in the Greater St. Louis metro area, provides them with financial assistance, and gives them significant professional exposure across the Midwest and nationally.
