CAM joins Museums for All initiative to expand free access, launches St. Louis as first "Hub City" in Missouri

February 7, 2023 (St. Louis, MO) - The Contemporary Art Museum St. Louis announces its participation in Museums for All, a signature access program of the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS), administered by the Association of Children's Museums (ACM). Museums for All encourages people of all backgrounds to build lifelong museum-going habits by offering reduced or free admission to low-income groups. By joining this national program, CAM expands its commitment to welcoming all audiences through its free admission program, an accessibility initiative that has been in place at the Museum since 2013. Along with a consortium of museums in the St. Louis area, including the National Blues Museum and the Pulitzer Arts Foundation, CAM has led St. Louis to become a Hub City in the Museums for All program—the first in the state of Missouri.

There are currently more than 1,000 institutions participating in Museums for All, including art museums, children's museums, science centers, botanical gardens, zoos, history museums, and more. These museums are located nationwide, representing all 50 states, the District of Columbia, and U.S. Virgin Islands. There are now more than 81 active Hub Cities, in which community members are able to access three or more participating museums in their area.

"This initiative has facilitated more than three million visits to date," said ACM Interim Executive Director Larry Hoffer. "Museums of all types show their commitment to access
