#### Semi-finalists selected for Great Rivers Biennial 2024



July 24, 2023 (St. Louis, MO) - The Contemporary Art Museum St. Louis and the Gateway Foundation announce 10 semi-finalists for the 2024 Great Rivers Biennial Arts Award Program (GRB). The semi-finalists were chosen from among 96 applications by a distinguished panel of jurors. The selected artists work in a wide range of media, including printmaking, sculpture, ceramics, textile, live arts, video, photography, painting, and drawing. Three finalists will receive an unrestricted award of \$20,000 and their work will be featured in the Great Rivers Biennial exhibition at CAM, on view from September 6, 2024–February 9, 2025.

This year's GRB jurors include Rita Gonzalez, Terri and Michael Smooke Curator and Department Head of Contemporary Art, Los Angeles County Museum of Art; Jamillah James, Manilow Senior Curator at the Museum of Contemporary Art Chicago; and Caroline Kent, a Chicago-based artist and Assistant Professor of Painting at the Weinberg College of Arts and Sciences at Northwestern University. The trio will visit each of the 10 semi-finalists in their studios before deliberating to select three awardees. An

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announcement about the finalists is forthcoming in August.

CAM's Ferring Foundation Chief Curator Dean Daderko and Associate Curator Misa Jeffereis will act as organizing curators for the Biennial, with assistance from Grace Early, Exhibitions Assistant. CAM staff will work with the finalists towards the realization of their exhibitions and related programming.

The Great Rivers Biennial is a collaborative initiative between CAM and the Gateway Foundation. The GRB identifies talent among emerging and mid-career artists working in the greater St. Louis metropolitan area, providing crucial financial support, and offering significant exposure in the Midwest and more broadly.
