

LEAP Middle School Initiative highlights collages, pizza paintings, and more in new exhibition by local teens





August 1, 2023 (St. Louis, MO) - The Contemporary Art Museum St. Louis presents a new exhibition of works made by middle school artists in the <u>LEAP Middle School Initiative</u> program. *LEAP Middle School Initiative: Collage, Portraits, and Pizzas* showcases a diverse and playful selection of art created by teen artists during the 2022–2023 academic year. The exhibition is on view in CAM's Education Galleries between September 8, 2023 and February 11, 2024.

LEAP is an after-school program for middle school-aged artists who are interested in exploring contemporary art practices and mediums. Resident Teaching Artists Jorge Rios and Jen Everett each worked with LEAP participants over a ten-week period to explore creative approaches to art making. In the fall, Rios worked with students to develop basic skills in two-dimensional representation through the use of drawing and water-based painting. These young artists also learned how to describe their work using foundational art history terminology. Capping off the semester, students had the opportunity to visit Katherine Bernhardt's studio, where they made their own playful "pizza paintings." Spring
