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# CAM's 2025 Dada Ball & Bash: Ripple Effect raises over \$370,000 to support ever-changing exhibitions and wave-making education programs

**April 16, 2025 (St. Louis, MO)**—The Contemporary Art Museum St. Louis (CAM) held the eleventh edition of the **Dada Ball & Bash: Ripple Effect** on Friday, April 11 at the historic Post Building. As the principal fundraiser of the year, the biennial Dada Ball & Bash raises more than ten percent of the Museum's operating budget in support of CAM's exhibitions and youth education programs. Dada Ball guests raised their paddles during the Fund the Need auction to ensure the continued support of programs such as New Art in the Neighborhood, Play Dates, and the Museum's ArtReach partnerships with local high school students and Sumner and Vashon High School. **The event generated over** 



\$370,000, which will directly support CAM's ever-changing exhibitions, wave-making education programs, and vibrant community initiatives.

This year's theme, *Ripple Effect*, was inspired by the Museum's current exhibition, *Like Water*, and guests enthusiastically dove in—donning flowing silhouettes, aquatic hues, and shimmering textures that reflected the exhibition's emotional, metaphorical, and poetic tribute to water.



Set in the storied Post Building, once home to the St. Louis Post-Dispatch, the space overflowed with community as guests enjoyed cocktails and a seated dinner. Dada Ball & Bash Chairs Paul Cambridge and Amanda Trudell, and Larnise and Scott Boain welcomed guests and spoke about the importance of not only viewing and creating art, but also immersing our community in art that reflects the world around us. Beloved Fox 2 News reporter and *Inside Studio STL* host Chelsea Haynes served as the evening's charismatic Fund the Need emcee, leading a wonderful and robust moment of giving that energized the crowd and reminded all in attendance of the deep impact of their contributions.

When the clock struck 9, the Dada Bash took over—ushering in waves of melody and sound courtesy of the one and only DJ Crim Dolla Cray, and a fabulous, fluid performance by Pack Dance Company that flooded the dance floor with contagious movement and ethereal energy.
